

Mobility Program

Since its beginnings, Esade has had a markedly international vocation, so it has progressively consolidated its relationships with universities around the world.

Students in the 4th year of the Bachelor's Degree in Global Governance, Economics & Legal Order will have the opportunity to carry out an international academic exchange at one of the prestigious universities in countries around the world with which Esade has exchange agreements.

The main aspects of the Exchange Program and how it fits into the structure of the degree program are presented below.

Exchange Program: Credit Recognition and Accumulation System

The Law School will recognize a minimum of 20 ECTS and a maximum of 30 ECTS to students for their participation in the Exchange Program. In order to obtain these ECTS, students must have passed the subjects to be taken at the host universities. In case of failure to pass one of the required subjects, the Program Management will decide in each case, after examining the circumstances, the number of credits to be recognized for the exchange.

Exchange assignment process

All students participating in the Exchange Program will stay during the first semester of the 4th and last year of the program.

During the month of December of the 3rd academic year, all the students of this course will be summoned by the International Relations team and will be introduced to the Exchange Program to explain its integration within the study plan, as well as the basic points of the process to be followed by those students who wish to participate in the program. They will also be given the list and basic information about the different host universities.

During the month of January, the Program Management team will provide students with the system to indicate their preferences regarding the universities where they wish to carry out their academic exchange and to manage the allocation of exchange places.

During the month of February, students will be assigned the places requested by each student based on the following criteria:

1. Student preferences
2. Academic record o **Grades?**
3. Available places at Each Exchange Institution
4. Language level required by the host university
