

Exchange Programme

ESADE has always maintained a clear international vocation since its foundation, progressively consolidating its relations with other universities around the world.

Fourth-year Law students have the opportunity to carry out an international exchange programme at one of the 37 prestigious universities in 17 countries around the world with which ESADE has an exchange agreement.

Below are details about this programme. In particular, we describe the Exchange Programme's fit within the Undergraduate Programme, the requirements to be able to study abroad and the list of available host law schools and universities.

Exchange Programme: Recognition and credit system

The Law School will recognise a maximum of 30 ECTS credits for students participating in the programme. To obtain all 30 ECTS credits, students have to successfully pass all their classes at the host university (worth an equivalent of 30 ECTS credits approximately). If students do not pass one of their classes, Programme Management will study the circumstances and decide on the total number of credits recognised for that student's time abroad.

Exchange Programme process

All students participating in the Exchange Programme will complete their stay abroad during the second semester of their fourth and last year in the Undergraduate Programme.

During the month of December in students' third year, the International Relations team will call them to a meeting to inform them about the Exchange Programme and its fit within the study plan. The team will also discuss how interested students can apply for the programme. Students will also be given an Exchange Programme Guide which includes the programme norms and a list with the different host universities and some basic information about them.

In January, the Registrar's Office will post the application form for the study abroad programme on the intranet. Students can use this form to indicate their preferences in terms of the host university where they would like to carry out their exchange.

In February, the university will assign students to the spots available at the host universities based on the following criteria:

1. Students' preferences
2. Their academic records
3. The spots available at each host university
4. Student's language skills depending on the country of the host university.

Results are published on the intranet.

Exchange Programme scholarships

Given the importance of the Exchange Programme within the Undergraduate Programme, students can apply for various scholarships. The aim is to help students to fulfil their aspirations in this respect.

The available scholarships include the following, amongst others:

- **Erasmus Scholarship**
This scholarship is available to all students from EU-member countries. The scholarship amount is for €100 per month throughout their time abroad.
- **AGAUR Scholarship**
Students can apply for this scholarship directly from the Catalan Government's University and Research Aid Management Agency (AGAUR). www.gencat.es/agaur
- **Santander-URL Scholarship**
If students do not qualify for the AGAUR Scholarship, URL offers a scholarship of €200 total through Banco Santander for the entire exchange programme.
- **Bancaja Scholarship**
Bancaja Scholarships are for Universitat Ramon Llull students carrying out exchange programmes outside of Europe.
