FILOSOFÍA DEL DERECHO

Can the imbalance between the position of the parties be a limit to their autonomy? Should the liberal prism on which civil or commercial contracts are based be reviewed? Does it make sense, for example, to reserve the control of validity/abusiveness to consumer contracts? How can we move towards a fairer contractual system without jeopardizing the legal certainty that must underpin contract law?
