



Origin of contributions received




Total contributions and distribution by allocation





If you are one of the **92** companies and foundations collaborating with our institution, we dedicate this section to your solidarity: your efforts represent decisive economic support for our foundational goals.



Driving talent: your collaboration opens doors

Driving talent is one of the key elements in fulfilling our mission to **"transform with purpose"**. We aim to attract the most brilliant and committed young people into our classrooms, ensuring that no economic, social or cultural barrier limits their development. But this goal would be unachievable without the support of companies and organizations like yours.

Through your commitment, alongside that of other collaborating organizations, we open our doors to new opportunities through research and the Talent Scholarship

Program. In other words, an essential bond is forged between the academic and business worlds, allowing the development of innovative research projects and access to educational opportunities through scholarships that transform lives.

Each project financed, each scholarship awarded and each initiative supported thanks to your collaboration, helps us to open the doors to talent and generate a positive and lasting impact on our society.

Tax benefits from your donations

In accordance with Spain's Act 49/2002, of December 23, on the Tax Regime of Non-Profit Entities and Tax Incentives for Patronage, those paying Spanish Personal Income Tax (individuals) or Corporation Tax (legal entities) will be entitled to deduct from the tax payable a percentage of their donations, gifts and irrevocable, pure and simple contributions made to entities that are covered by the tax regime of the aforementioned Act.

The percentage deductions applicable to donations by legal entities are as follows:

40%

Those paying Corporation Tax will be entitled to deduct from the tax payable, reduced by the deductions and rebates established in Chapters II, III and IV of Title VI of Corporation Tax Act 43/1995, of December 27, **40% of the tax deduction base**.

50%

Meanwhile, in the case of recurrent donations, **the 40% will be increased to 50%** if the company or entity made donations of an equal or greater amount or value to the same foundation during the preceding two fiscal years.

Endowment

Esade Foundation Fund: building a solid future

The endowment is a key financial formula to guarantee the solidity and continuity of our foundation's activities over time. In 2007 we created the **Esade Foundation Fund**, giving us access to a stable source of income which we allocate to strategic long-term projects, such as our Scholarship Program.

Our endowment draws on the contributions of donors and committed organizations who decide to allocate their contribution to this purpose. It is managed rigorously, to ensure that future generations will have the same capacity to act as in the present (intergenerational equity).



To this end, we reinvest a percentage of the contributions received as part of the yield on the investment (interest, dividends, capital gains, etc.) into the fund itself, allowing us to maintain its purchasing power in terms of inflation. This means we can ensure that your contributions remain permanent over time.

Our endowment is furthermore committed to principles of socially responsible investment, and aims to invest in other funds or initiatives aligned with the values of our academic institution.





Evaluation of educational equity in Spain through PISA 2022

In December 2023, the OECD published the results of the first large-scale international evaluation since the pandemic: PISA 2022. Just a week later, Esade Centre for Economic Policy (EsadeEcPol), in partnership with Save the Children, used the data to present the most complete and detailed analysis produced to date on educational equity in Spain and its 17 autonomous regions.

This alliance between the worlds of academia and charity not only gave us an immediate and rigorous analysis of the microdata from PISA 2022, but also generated a unique snapshot of one of the greatest challenges of our educational system: opportunity inequality.

The data reveal persistent gaps

The results of the report reveal a complex landscape in terms of educational equity in Spain. On the one hand, Spain displays relative strength in terms of equity in learning: one in every six points of difference in the mathematics score can be explained by socioeconomic inequality, a similar proportion to the OECD average. However, this apparent equity conceals deeper inequalities in educational pathways.

The requirement to repeat a year emerges as one of the main mechanisms of inequality: given equal academic performance, **a student with a low socioeconomic level is almost 4 times as likely to repeat the year as one with a high level**, the second-biggest gap in the OECD. This practice, which affects 22% of Spanish students, has dramatic consequences on their future educational and occupational pathways.

Migrant origin likewise plays a crucial role: **although the raw gap in mathematics is 32.5 points, this shrinks to just 6.6 points if we take into account socioeconomic level**, suggesting that the disadvantage lies not so much in migrant origin *per se*, but in the associated socioeconomic conditions. Nonetheless, school segregation by migrant origin has increased significantly since 2018, in particular in regions such as Catalonia, the Basque Country and Madrid.

As for gender, **the gap enjoyed by boys in mathematics has grown in 13 out of the 17 regions, amounting to 10.1 points at the national level**. Paradoxically, boys are twice as likely to repeat a year as girls with the same academic performance.

Specific measures to increase equal opportunities

The report does not simply diagnose, but also proposes an ambitious roadmap to improve equity. One of the most urgent measures highlighted is the need to emphasize individual and small-group tutorials, both during and outside school hours. This intervention, which is supported by robust international evidence (such as the evaluation of the Mentores program conducted by EsadeEcPol), could be especially effective in closing the learning gap.

Emphasis is likewise placed on the importance of improving access for underprivileged families to quality infant education between the ages of 0 and 3 years, a crucial stage for cognitive and socio-emotional development. In parallel, a reform of teacher education is proposed,

focused on classroom management in contexts of diversity, and a change in pedagogical practices associated with students repeating a year.

To address school segregation, the report argues for integrated plans combining charter school provision that is genuinely free of charge, along with school planning measures which are of particular importance in a context of demographic decline.

Impact on public debate and educational policy

With more than **130 media impacts** and an outstanding response from political leaders – from the Minister of Education to regional government ministers –, the report has made a significant contribution in focusing public debate as to educational equity in Spain.

This joint study by EsadeEcPol and Save the Children thus demonstrates the power of collaboration between academic research and social organizations to generate evidence driving fairer educational policy. At the same time, it represents a valuable example of how rigorous research, combined with knowledge on the ground, can help transform the educational and social reality of our country.

Talent Scholarship Program

Our academic institution's social impact and commitment to equal opportunities is best reflected by the Talent Scholarship Program. This is a strategic initiative to attract the highest-potential students – above all those with outstanding academic track records and challenging circumstances – and provide them with access to quality teaching which will change their lives.


Our scholarships cover **between 60% and 100% of the enrollment cost** – for degrees and double degrees – and between 50% and 85% of the enrollment – for masters and MBAs –, and can be maintained until the studies are completed.

Thanks to the contributions received during the 2023-2024 academic year – including yours –, we allocated a record **5.4 million euros**, allowing us to award **295 scholarships** over the course of 2024-2025.

We continue to increase the coverage of our scholarships

We would emphasize that in 2024-2025 **we have achieved an average coverage of 86% in our degree and double degree scholarships**, the highest in the history of the Talent Scholarship Program, while the percentage coverage for first-year students remained at 91%. This figure highlights our effort to increase the support offered to our scholarship recipients. It should in this regard be recalled that in 2010-2011, the average coverage was just 53%.

We have progressively increased the percentage covered by the scholarships we grant to degree and double degree students over recent years:



Organizations, major donors or a group of alumni join together to award a scholarship named for its sponsors, with the aim of multiplying opportunities. These named scholarships thus draw on funds from their sponsors to benefit a specific group of students and/or a study program.

These are the three types of named scholarships covered by our Talent Scholarship Program:

Corporate Scholarships

granted by organizations

Future Scholarships

granted by one or more individual donors

Class Scholarships

granted by groups of students from the same graduating class

Corporate Scholarships, the bridge between talent and organizations

At the Esade Institutional Development & Engagement unit we offer committed organizations the opportunity to contribute to initiatives in support of talent. Our Corporate Scholarships establish a link between the business world in the educational sphere, offering brilliant students who have limited resources the chance to study at Esade.

Meanwhile, these scholarships also give them a chance to discover at first hand the operations and business model of the Collaborating organizations, through visits to their

headquarters which enrich the beneficiary students' education with real-world experience.

At Esade we are convinced that this bridge between talent and organizations has a positive social impact, and highlights their culture of corporate social responsibility.

**/6.2.1.2****Complementary scholarships**

Those students who received one of our Talent Scholarships can also apply for a complementary scholarship to help them cover other everyday costs connected with their studies, such as travel and accommodation.

These complementary scholarships can be combined, and are awarded in accordance with the economic circumstances and academic excellence of each student.

**Esade Lodging Grants**

Intended for scholarship students living outside the province of Barcelona, funding between 50% and 100% of a place at one of the university halls of residence with which we have an agreement.

**Esade Living Grants**

Intended for scholarship students living outside the province of Barcelona, to help them cover the living costs associated with travel to the city throughout the program.

**Esade Exchange Scholarships**

A grant to pay for accommodation in the destination country for those students already assigned an exchange semester.

Academic Merit Awards*

These awards are grants which can cover as much as the entire enrollment fee for the first year of study, for those with an outstanding academic record. We have established the following award formats:

- **Best University Entrance Grade:** covers up to 100% of the enrollment fee for the first academic year. It can be renewed each year of the course for those students who pass all their subjects from the previous year and are placed in the top 25% for their year.
- **Academic Distinction:** covers up to 25% of the enrollment fee for the first academic year for students with a high average grade in their respective educational systems.
- **Honors:** an economic award for students obtaining this highest academic distinction in the core and required subjects on their degree program.
- **Academic Excellence:** covers up to 75% of the enrollment fee for the first academic year for students with outstanding average grades in their respective educational systems.

*Achieving the minimum grade does not guarantee that the award will be made; at Esade we will also take into account the information included in the award application, the motivation letter and the student's general profile. Awards will be made on a strictly first come, first served basis, with the percentage varying according to the candidate's merits and the resources available at the time of admission.




Other financial grants

We offer other types of financial grant to address the different needs of our students: from degree students choosing to continue their education on our master's programs, to families who have more than one child studying with us, as well as new students requiring some type of assistance which cannot be covered by our scholarships or our awards.

Meanwhile, all students on our research programs (Master in Research and PhD) receive a financial grant to help them develop their research.
