The courses listed as **LLB+JD** are **elective courses**, which are open to both LLB (undergraduate) and JD (postgraduate) students. In effect, they attend the same class. The courses listed as **LLB/JD** are **compulsory courses**. For these courses, the LLB and JD students are segregated. Unless otherwise indicated, all courses are the equivalent of 1 SMU course unit.

Students must bid for the LLB+JD, LLB/JD and JD courses. For exchange students, the [BOSS Bidding](#) windows (Singapore Standard Time – UTC/GMT+8hrs) are as follows:

You will be able to access your E-account via [OASIS](#) (student portal) from **24 July 2026**. There will be an **online course bidding workshop held on 27 July 2026, 4 – 5.30pm (Singapore Standard Time – UTC/GMT+8hrs)**, to help you familiarise with the bidding system and answer any questions you may have. More details will be sent to you via email.

THEMIS students coming to the Singapore Management University (“SMU”) are required to take and pass a course load of four course units (4CUs) from the courses listed in the table above in order to be eligible for the THEMIS Joint Certificate.

If required by the student’s home university for the student to take a course load of five course units (5CUs), so that the student can still be eligible for the THEMIS Joint Certificate even if they fail one course unit (1CU), the student must choose four course units (4CUs) from the courses listed in the table above and one course unit (1CU) from the general course program.

Although the School will endeavour to cater to each student’s selection of courses, the School is not able to ensure that all students will get the courses of their first choice (i.e. due to limited slots in each course, competition for seats, and class size). THEMIS students should bid for the courses in the manner that they will be briefed on regarding the BOSS Bidding process. Students should not approach the faculty directly to request to enter courses or demand to take a course (e.g. by claiming that the course is a mandatory one).
