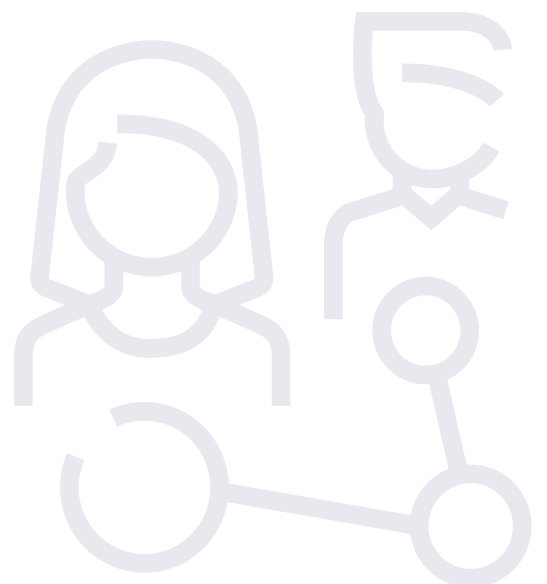

EsadeGeo's MOOC: *Geopolítica y gobernanza global*

The world is global. Its challenges collective. And its future uncertain. This EsadeGeo course on geopolitics and global governance helps to understand the social, economic, energy, and technological dynamics that will define the world to come.

Launched in 2015, more than 47,354 students have enrolled in EsadeGeo's MOOC, hosted by Coursera.

MBA Course: Global Governance the 21st Century

In the highly complex and interdependent world of the 21st century, it is crucial to understand how major issues on the international stage reverberate in geopolitics, global governance, and daily life.

This course aims to comprehensively address some of today's most pressing international challenges and, in doing so, enhance students' capacity for strategic analysis related to these challenges.

In this course, students start broadening their understanding of current affairs through an introductory session which provides a first glimpse of global governance and geopolitics in the 21st century. The following eleven sessions offered in-depth looks into the most prominent issues on the international agenda today, as well as the interplay between political trends and business strategies.



Selected sessions zoomed in on topics such as the US and its global role, the international implications of China's rise, the EU and its regulatory power, energy and climate change, international security and global inequality, global health governance, and firms and their non-market environments.

Dr. Solana taught eight of the eleven sessions. For six of these sessions, he invited prominent guest speakers to join him in a conversation.

The remaining three sessions were taught by EsadeGeo professors Ángel Saz-Carranza and Marie Vandendriessche.

ENGAGE is a three-and-a-half-year EU-funded Horizon 2020 project led by Esade Business and Law School. The project, titled '**Envisioning a New Governance Architecture for a Global Europe**' in full, brings together the first-class interdisciplinary expertise of scholars from nine academic institutions and four think tanks from across Europe:

Running from January 2021 until June 2024, ENGAGE focuses on how the EU – both the institutions and its member states – can effectively and sustainably harness all of its tools to enable a coherent, sustainable, and effective external action, in line with the European Commission's push for stronger and more united European voice in the world.

ENGAGE identifies key challenges that the EU's external action faces, from the rise of nationalism and the contestation of multilateralism to climate change, conflicts in the EU's neighbourhood and the acceptability of EU external action from the perspective of citizens and national decisionmakers. With these challenges in mind, the project assesses existing governance structures and treaties and a set of strategic objectives – engaging with strategic partners, neighbouring regions, and conflict scenarios – to provide policymakers with concrete recommendations and tools.

The work of the project will ultimately lead to a White Paper for Joined-up, Coherent, Sustainable, and Effective External Action and help inspire an inclusive and representative EU-wide conversation.

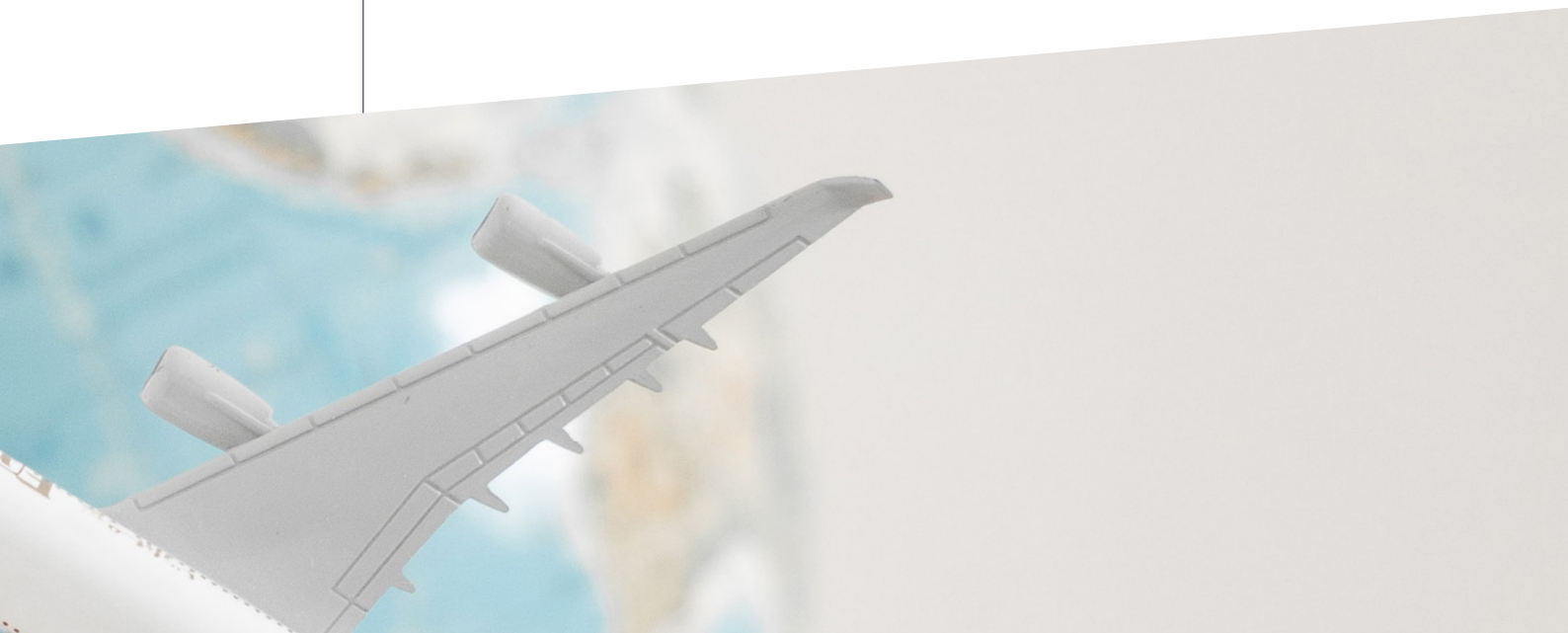
Funded by the European Commission's Horizon 2020 program, the GLOBE ('Global Governance and the European Union: Future Trends and Scenarios') project addresses strategic priorities identified in the EU Global Strategy. By developing new theoretical and methodological approaches, GLOBE will provide policymakers, academics and the general public with an analytical grip on the state of play in global governance. The project hopes to equip national and European policymakers with tools to identify constraints and opportunities in a set of global governance scenarios for 2030 and 2050.

GLOBE is coordinated by Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (IBEI), and runs from January 2019 until December 2022. The project brings together an academic consortium of ten partners from eight countries, composed of European and international academics and policymakers, including Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (Spain); ESADE Business & Law School (Spain); Katholieke Universiteit Leuven (Belgium); University College London (UK); Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin für Sozialforschung (Germany); Hebrew University of Jerusalem (Israel); Facultad Latinoamericana Ciencias Sociales (Argentina); Universitas Bina Nusantara (Indonesia); ISGlobal Barcelona Institute for Global Health (Spain); and Peking University (China). The strength of this consortium lies in the first-class academic expertise of top European and international scholars, which will guarantee not only high-level analysis of the past and present problems of global governance but also a set of solid forward-looking trends and scenarios.

Within the GLOBE project, EsadeGeo leads the work packages on security and migration (WP4) and foresight exercises and scenario-building (WP9), while also contributing to workstreams on innovative global governance research methods and recommendations and strategies for policymakers based on global governance scenarios.

WEBINAR | MAPPING THE FUTURE EUROPEAN HYDROGEN ECONOMY

September 14, 2021

Building a sustainable and competitive hydrogen market in Europe will require significant infrastructure development related to hydrogen production, transmission, storage, and distribution. The topology of a future hydrogen network will therefore depend, to a large degree, on the balance between the optimal areas for hydrogen production, the location of end users, and the delivery options to link the two. When it comes to transmission and distribution, options such as pipelines, trucks, and ships are all under study, alongside a level of re-purposing and hydrogen blending of existing gas pipelines, while energy storage facilities such as salt caverns may also play a role.

Moderated by EsadeGeo director Ángel Saz, this webinar explored the logistical and infrastructure-related development of a future European hydrogen economy and evaluated the optimal combinations of production locations and scales, transportation, and storage.

The panel was composed of Giulia-Maria Branzi, Head of Climate Policies at SNAM; Maria Deryugina, Innovation, Communication and Regulation Manager of Hydrogen Direction at Repsol; Gökçe Mete, Head of Secretariat, Leadership Group for the Industry Transition, Stockholm Environment Institute; and Monica Swanson, Program Manager Hydrogen Corridors, New Business & Portfolio/International, Port of Rotterdam.

WEBINAR | THE EUROPEAN UNION IN A GEOPOLITICAL WORLD

October 26, 2021

EsadeGeo and the State Secretariat for the European Union at the Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs presented a joint webinar, which analyzed the current geopolitical standing of the European Union and the role it can aspire to.

The session delved into questions such as the EU's position in global trade, its active role at the World Trade Organization, and the so-called Brussels Effect. It also looked into the EU's role in global security, its push to reset relations with the US after Biden's election, and its strategy to counter China's Belt and Road Initiative.

The discussion served as the basis for a set of proposals made in the context of the Conference on the Future of Europe, to be debated at Esade Business School in Barcelona on November 16, 2021.

The panel, chaired and moderated by EsadeGeo President Javier Solana, included Mireya Solís, Director of the Center for East Asian Studies, Brookings Institution; Jeffrey Anderson, Professor at the BMW Center for German and European Studies, Walsh School of Foreign Service, Georgetown University; and Stefan Lehne, Visiting Scholar, Carnegie Europe.



WEBINAR | LA IDENTIFICACIÓN Y GESTIÓN DE RIESGOS DEL ENTORNO NO COMERCIAL [SPA]

November 12, 2021

What risks do Spanish multinationals face in the non-commercial environment? Which ones are produced in the countries where these companies operate? What non-commercial strategies do they carry out to deal with these risks?

With the aim of answering these questions, EsadeGeo and FTI Consulting prepared the report "Riders on the storm: measuring and managing nonmarket risks", which identifies the main risks faced by Spanish multinational companies in the non-market environment on a global scale, both before and after the COVID-19 crisis, as well as the strategies they carry out in the management of their public affairs. The document also makes the EsadeGeo/FTI Nonmarket Country Index available as a free access tool: a world map of geopolitical risks for companies.

The report "Riders on the storm: measuring and managing nonmarket risks" was presented on November 12, 2021. The webinar included the participation of Javier Solana, President of EsadeGeo (welcome address); Ángel Saz-Carranza, director of EsadeGeo, and Juan Rivera, Senior Managing Director, FTI Consulting (presentation of the report); while Ángel Bautista, Director of Institutional Relations at Repsol, and Jon Lezamiz, Global Director of Public Affairs at Siemens Gamesa, took part in a discussion titled "Non-market risks in the era of COVID-19" and moderated by Alicia González, International Economics correspondent for El País. The closing remarks were made by Blanca Perea, Senior Managing Director, FTI Consulting.



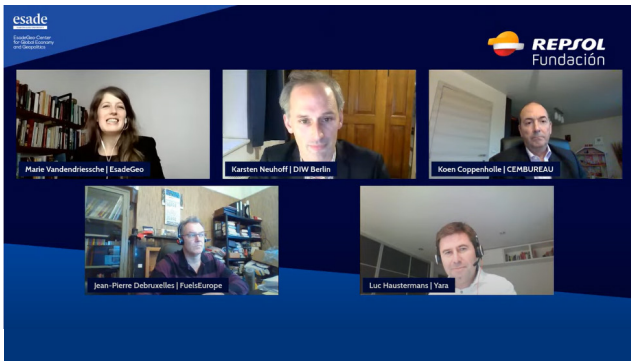
EUROPE FACING GEOPOLITICAL CHALLENGE OF THE 21ST CENTURY

November 16, 2021

Juan González-Barba, Secretary of State for the European Union, participated on 16 November in the conference 'Europe facing geopolitical challenge of the 21st century'. The conference was organized by EsadeGeo and the Secretary of State for the European Union within the framework of the Spanish contribution to the Conference on the Future of Europe.

The face-to-face session was held at Esade's Pedralbes Campus in Barcelona on 16 November in a symposium format. Working groups made up of students and young professionals presented proposals for EU geopolitical reform to a panel of experts: Javier Solana, President, Esade Geo; Juan González-Barba, Secretary of State for the European Union, Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Manuel Szapiro, European Commission in Barcelona; Esther Barbé, UAB-IBEI; Jacint Jordana, UPF-IBEI; Pol Morillas, CIDOB; Anna Bosch, RTVE; and Ángel Saz Carranza, EsadeGeo.

These discussions led to the formulation by EsadeGeo of proposals to improve EU's external action that were included in the citizen platform for the Conference on the Future of Europe. The European parliament, council, and commission have promised to listen to European citizens and consider the recommendations made in their respective spheres.



WEBINAR | THE EU'S CARBON BORDER ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

December 1, 2021

In its vision to achieve its climate objectives, the EU seeks to decarbonize its industry without sacrificing its competitiveness. Failure to get the balance right entails a potential risk of carbon leakage, wherein carbon-intensive production is relocated abroad to jurisdictions with less stringent or non-existent climate policies. One of the main tools the European Commission is proposing to address this risk is a Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM), which seeks to equalize the price of carbon between products produced in the EU and imports of those same items.

In the midst of the negotiations on this important proposal, this webinar aimed to delve into the central question of whether the CBAM is conducive to a thriving and decarbonized industry in Europe. The panel gathered key stakeholders to evaluate how the CBAM proposal will affect EU industrial producers.

Senior Researcher at EsadeGeo Marie Vandendriessche introduced and moderated the webinar, which involved the participation of Koen Coppenhelle, Chief Executive at CEMBUREAU; Jean-Pierre Debruxelles, Senior Policy Executive at FuelsEurope; Luc Haustermans, Head of EU Public Affairs and Industry Relations at Yara; and Karsten Neuhoff, Head of the Department of Climate Policy at DIW Berlin, and Professor at the Institute for Economics and Law of Technical University Berlin.

**THE GLOBAL ANNUAL ENERGY MEETING 10TH EDITION
FIT FOR 55: ACCELERATING THE ENERGY TRANSITION AND THE RE-INDUSTRIALIZATION OF EUROPE**

January-February 2022

At the 10th edition of the Global Annual Energy Meeting, EsadeGeo hosted, together with the Representation of the European Commission in Spain and EIT InnoEnergy, a series of events to explore the social, economic and geopolitical impacts of these policies, which will feature on the negotiating table in 2022.

The series, called "Fit for 55: Accelerating the Energy Transition and the Re-Industrialization of Europe", delved into the internal and external implications of the EU's Fit for 55 legislative package, focusing on the opportunities and risks of the energy transition towards 2030, the EU's carbon border adjustment mechanism and its effects on countries that export to the EU, and the impact of the package for European industry.



SESSION 1A | KEYNOTE SPEECHES

January 28, 2022

The first day featured keynotes speeches by Frans Timmermans, Executive Vice President of the European Commission for the European Green Deal, and Teresa Ribera, Vice-President of the Spanish Government and Minister for Ecological Transition and Demographic Challenge who discussed the challenges and opportunities of the energy transition for the EU and its Member States, as well as the implications of the Fit-for-55 legislative package.

SESSION 1B | ASSESSING THE COLLECTIVE IMPACT OF FIT-FOR-55: A VIEW FROM INDUSTRY

January 28, 2022

The keynote speeches were followed by a panel of four top executives – leading Air Liquide Spain, Galp, Repsol and Siemens Gamesa – who provided their views on the impact of the Fit-for-55 package on the EU's industries.



SESSION 2 | DERISKING THE ENERGY TRANSITION: ENERGY SECURITY AMID TRADITIONAL AND NEW RISKS

February 1, 2022

The second day involved a panel of think tank, academic and industry experts discussing geopolitical, market, industrial and employment risks and solutions related to the Fit for 55 package and the EU's energy transition more generally.

What risks can be expected to arise in the context of the energy transition that is already in motion and will continue accelerating on the road to climate neutrality by 2050? How may the EU's energy security be affected and indeed redefined, and what can be done to address this? What strategies is the EU already implementing to mitigate risks associated with the energy transition, and what further strategies can it consider? These and other questions were addressed during the session.



SESSION 3 | THE EXTERNAL DIMENSION OF FIT FOR 55: EU GLOBAL LEADERSHIP THROUGH THE CBAM?

February 3, 2022

The final session focused on the EU's proposed Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) and its external effects. This session brought together think tank and academic experts to discuss how the CBAM can act as an enabler for international climate cooperation.

Can the CBAM create incentives for exporters to adjust their practices and emulate EU policies? What impact will the tool have on developing countries and how does the CBAM rhyme with climate cooperation with the Global South, particularly in light of the UNFCCC negotiations? How can international coordination on border carbon adjustments be strengthened through international agreements or so-called "climate clubs"? These and other questions were addressed during the session.

WEBINAR | ALIGNING INDUSTRY AND ENERGY TRANSITIONS FOR A CLIMATE-NEUTRAL EU

February 11, 2022

The EU is legally committed to reaching climate neutrality by 2050. This road will imply many challenges for energy-intensive industries, which will need to deploy clean and affordable technologies to accelerate the transition. For example, the transformation will require substantially higher consumption of renewable electricity by industry and greater coordination with the power sector.

This webinar explored the path towards climate neutrality for the power and industry sectors. How can these two sectors interact to ensure the provision of competitively priced and reliable sustainable electricity? What kind of enabling infrastructure and technologies will be needed to cover the future demands of electricity and green hydrogen? How can supply and demand-side instruments help align the transition in both sectors while avoiding potential disruptions and ensuring industrial competitiveness and employment? These questions and others were addressed during the session.

Ángel Saz-Carranza, Director at EsadeGeo, introduced and moderated the webinar, which started with a keynote speech by Joaquim Nunes de Almeida, Director for Mobility & Energy Intensive Industries at the European Commission in the Directorate-General for Internal Market, Industry, Entrepreneurship and SMEs (DG GROW). It was followed by a panel composed of Ángel Bautista, Director of Institutional Relations at Repsol; Brigitta Huckestein, Senior Manager for Energy and Climate Policy at BASF; and Stefan Lechtenböhmer, Director of the Research Group Future Energy and Mobility Structures at the Wuppertal Institute for Climate, Environment and Energy.

WEBINAR | TECHNOLOGIES OF THE ENERGY TRANSITION: ULTRA-FAST EV CHARGING

February 24, 2022

Battery electric vehicles accounted for 11.2% of all new car registrations in Western Europe in 2021. The rollout of charging points and the necessary infrastructure, however, is still lagging behind. Furthermore, with consumers demanding faster charging times and car manufacturers introducing EVs with higher power charging levels, it is important to ensure that the charging infrastructure is able to support it.

Some of the challenges in ensuring ultra-fast EV charging at charging stations include high operational costs and insufficient capacity in certain locations. In order to examine these challenges and potential solutions, this webinar brought together a range of stakeholders from industry—charging, battery energy storage and vehicle manufacturing—and policy research.

The speakers discussed their perspectives on questions such as: What are the biggest challenges to ultra-fast charging at present? How can battery energy storage help in situations where grid power is expensive or insufficient? What role can EV manufacturers play? And how can the deployment of ultra-fast charging infrastructure be promoted?

Marie Vandendriessche, Senior Researcher at EsadeGeo, introduced the webinar and moderated the panel composed of Siridia Berenguer, Director of New Businesses BD, Repsol; Julia Hildermeier, Associate, Regulatory Assistance Project; Xavier Pons, Head of Infrastructures & Energy Services, Nissan Iberia; and Álvaro Vázquez, Head of E-mobility in Spain, ABB.



WAR AND PEACE IN THE 21ST CENTURY A NEW ERA OF GEOPOLITICS IN EUROPE: HOW CAN THE EU SECURE A NEW PEACE IN UKRAINE?

March 12, 2022

CIDOB's annual War and Peace conference, held on March 12, analyzed the security architecture in Europe after Russia's aggression in Ukraine and the extent to which the EU and other actors can help to secure a new peace in the continent.

Russia's aggression against Ukraine has posed an unprecedented threat to the contemporary European and international security order. It has caused unjustifiable bloodshed, undermined Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity, and revived the prospects of major conflict in Europe. The European Union and the West have responded with exceptional measures, including a strong package of economic and targeted sanctions against the Kremlin, the provision of military equipment to Ukraine, and the use of common European resources to strengthen the defense capacities of the country.

Current transformations of the global order also demand a stronger role of the European Union if it still wants to play its part. The renewed centrality of security and defense in Europe has reinvigorated the role of NATO, while concepts such as European strategic autonomy must evolve to add value to multiple areas of the EU's external action, from geoeconomics and trade to digital and technological transformations, global health, climate policies, cybersecurity, or artificial intelligence. In line with the challenges posed by a more geopolitical environment, the EU must acquire the capabilities, align its strategic priorities, and enhance the political will to act as a global player and speak on an equal basis to other global powers.

CIDOB's annual War and Peace conference unfolded in two main directions. First, it analyzed the security architecture in Europe after Russia's aggression in Ukraine and the extent to which the EU and other actors can help to secure a new peace in the continent, while keeping alive the ambition of European strategic autonomy. Second, it assessed the return to a more geopolitical environment and discussed whether the EU is sufficiently equipped to act as an effective and constructive global player.

BARCELONA WORKSHOP ON GLOBAL GOVERNANCE: GLOBAL CRISES AND GLOBAL GOVERNANCE

May 16-17, 2022

The biannual Barcelona Workshop on Global Governance is a venue for the study of global governance—its structure, effects, and problems—from an interdisciplinary perspective, bringing together scholarship from international relations, law, sociology, anthropology, political theory, public administration and history. Organized by EsadeGeo (Esade Business School’s Center for Global Economy and Geopolitics) and IBEI (Institut Barcelona d’Estudis Internacionals), we seek to explore difficult but pressing questions, bringing together a dynamic group of scholars from different theoretical approaches and analytical traditions.

In 2022, a new edition of the BWGG was organized, titled “Global Crises and Global Governance”. On May 16 the workshop, hosted by IBEI, included the following panels: Informal Governance and Crisis Management; How Institutions Adapt; Transnational Governance; Institutions of Global Governance Beyond Treaty-based Actors; and Governance and Crisis in the EU. On May 17 the workshop took place at Esade, where Director-General Koldo Echebarria gave the welcome remarks and the panels featured were: International Institutions and Crisis Response; Crisis and Institutional Change; Designing Institutions; Addressing Crises; and The Role of Non-State Actors.





WEBINAR - ENERGY SECURITY IN THE EU: RESPONDING TO THE EFFECTS OF THE UKRAINE INVASION

June 1, 2022

EsadeGeo and the Repsol Foundation organized a series of two webinars to provide deep analysis of the impacts of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on the EU's energy system and relations. This first webinar focused on the EU's energy security in the wake of the conflict.

As a result of the invasion, basic pillars of the EU's energy security have been intensely questioned and scrutinized, and a significant policy overhaul has been put into motion. On May 18, 2022, the European Commission launched the REPowerEU plan, detailing the actions to be taken to end dependence on Russian fossil fuels while also tackling the climate crisis. In this webinar, speakers discussed the REPowerEU plan, the effects of the war on the EU's energy security, and to what extent the plan tackles three overarching challenges: affordability of energy, reducing reliance on Russian energy, and accelerating the energy transition towards climate neutrality.

Marie Vandendriessche, Senior Researcher at EsadeGeo, introduced and moderated the webinar, which started with a keynote speech by Tatiana Márquez Uriarte, Member of the Cabinet of Commissioner Simson at the European Commission. It was followed by a panel composed of Adolfo Aiello, Deputy Director General Climate & Energy at EUROFER; Ana Álvarez, Head of EU Public Affairs at Repsol; and Agata Łoskot-Strachota, Senior Fellow at the Centre for Eastern Studies.

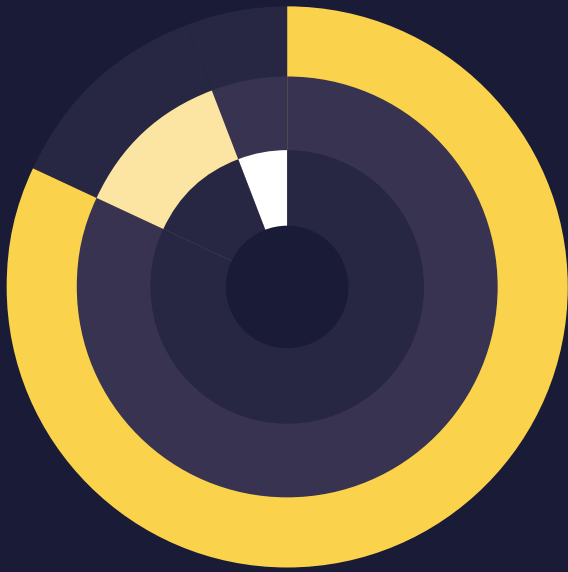
