### Welcome to Esade!

#### Welcome to Barcelona

Barcelona, a city with an open, Mediterranean spirit, offers a wide range of attractions that make it a fascinating city to visit and live in. The urban transformation that took place during the Olympic Games in 1992 and the spectacular creation of 15 km of beaches along the city coastline are some of the most recent innovations in a city rich in architectural treasures - namely its Gothic and Modernist heritage, with Gaudi as the central figure.

#### Barcelona Campus

The Esade Barcelona Campus, covering a total of 29,475 m<sup>2</sup>, is located in Pedralbes, one of the city's most attractive residential neighbourhoods, just off the Avenida Diagonal and close to Barcelona's main university area. It is within a stone's throw of the Pedralbes Monastery, home to the Thyssen-Bornemisza art collection, and the Royal Palace of Pedralbes. The Campus is surrounded by parks and gardens and features all the resources and services essential for university life.


The workshop will be held at the Barcelona Campus, located in the Pedralbes neighborhood, close to the university zone on Diagonal Avenue.



#### Getting here

#### Public transport



**FGC** The closest FGC station is Reina Elisenda L6, just 250 meters from Esade.

> The nearest underground station is María Cristina (line 3), around 500 meters from Esade.

**Travel Cards:** If you are planning to stay in Barcelona a few more days, then the most convenient option you can opt for is a **T-casual** travel card. This card is valid for 10 trips using public transport. A zone 1 T-casual will carry you all around Barcelona city and costs **11.35** $\in$ .


With a T-casual travel card, available in every metro or train station, you can take any public transport in Barcelona and commute for 75 minutes between the first and last validation when changing lines or mode of transport.

**Taxis:** Taxis are still relatively cheap in Barcelona. From the airport, please allow around 20-minute journey (30-40 at rush hour). The average cost is around 30€.

#### Geography and Climate

Barcelona is a coastal city with over four kilometers of urban beachfront and large areas of nearby forests. The city's location makes it the ideal departure point from which to discover new landscapes and enjoy natural environments. Within a radius of a little over 200 Km, you will find charming towns and resorts offering a wealth of cultural as well as historic and recreational attractions such as ski resorts or magnificent beaches.

Barcelona's Mediterranean location means it enjoys a warm and welcoming year-round climate. Its five kilometers of beachfront offer all the latest amenities, including an Olympic marina used by local inhabitants to practice water sports throughout the year. With sunshine on the shores of the Mediterranean practically guaranteed, dining in openair restaurants or stopping off for a drink at one of city's many pavement cafés is always an option.

#### Palau de la Música Catalana

Domènech i Montaner's extraordinary concert hall is the epitome of Modernism: the explosion in tile, sculpture and glass makes any event here special!

#### Park Güell

An incomplete, fantasying vision of Gaudí's ideal world. Gaudí's fascination with natural forms found full expression in this park (1900-1914), where he blurred the distinction between natural and artificial forms in a series of colonnades winding up the hill.

#### Church Sagrada Família

Modernism's most eccentric, ambitious monument. Gaudí, who is said to have joked "My client is no in a hurry" is buried beneath the nave, he dedicates more than 40 years to the project. <u>Pre-booking tickets</u> is HIGHLY recommended as it is a really popular tourist destination and the queues are otherwise very long!

#### Picasso Museum

A record of the vital formative years that the Young Picasso spent nearby at la Llotja art school.

#### The Cathedral

The present-day Cathedral is the third church to stand on this site. The first one, destroyed in 985, was rebuilt in Gothic style but not ended until 15th century.

#### Escape from urban hustle!

#### Montjuïc

#### Access from Plaça d'España

Offers a precious escape with spectacular views of Barcelona and its port. The long axis from Plaça d'España is still the most popular access to the park, with the climb now eased by a sequence of open-air escalators.

#### Tibidabo

#### Tramvia Blau and funicular railway www.tibidabo.es

Thousands of people head to the top of the hill in order to whoop and scream at the funfair! Great views of Barcelona!
